Club report - November-December 2021

It's been a busy month, despite several weather-related cancellations. The most positive aspects were the way the club pulled together after Steedie was flipped on top of Honesty during Storm Arwen, causing damage to one of the trailers and both boats. Luckily, the damage was largely superficial and fixable.

More than 15 people turned up at very short notice to move the boats and trailers safely and to get the oars and other gear to a safe place. Graham quickly fixed the rowlocks and cleared up Prestongrange to make space for Steedie - and another 8 volunteers helped move Steedie on the same afternoon.

Stewart fixed the broken trailer - and put a new jockey wheel lock on the other trailer after it collapsed as Honesty was manoeuvered back into place at the end of a very long Saturday!

The other focus has been on Skiffieworlds, with a coxes' meeting and an open club meeting as we start to finalise our arrangements.

Meanwhile, we have had some great rowing in between the extreme weather - the new member sessions have gone down well and we have some really good emerging talent in the club. We have offered a good mixture of sessions, which are filling up well - although the perennial challenge of cox shortages is still with us.

Boatshed - Gaynor

Building warrant submitted 30th Oct. 2 issues being queried continually - Durisol blocks and fire designation. Fire designation require doors & windows 1m from boundary. Council have allocated 1m to facilitate. A relaxation has been requested. Slow responses.

Electricity cables have been identified and moved. No additional expense expected from live cables already moved.

Actions:

Steedie in Prestongrange. Council didn't know boat was back in until Graham found a way to tell the manager. Emailed and mix up sorted. So far boat is ok to be there. Not ideal conditions, cold, paint isn't working, rain leakage. Gouges filled, painting to be finished. Yellow paint has been discontinued(!) looking for alternative type. Oars are pending – Gaynor and George are going to attempt oar make and mend!

Actions: David to move new H&S items out of the kitchen and into boats!

Skiffieworlds – David & Gaynor

Meeting has been held (open & coxes). Organisers have contacted to start registering teams and individuals.

Training to start in NY, using common commands etc. Crews to be thought about.

Lodges now Friday to Friday and Monday to Monday.

Actions: David & Gaynor to follow up with organisers/attendees to start registration process. David to liaise with Pauline on ferry payments
